




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MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD CHAIR AND CEO

Puffing Billy Railway (PBR) is an iconic part of Melbourne cultural heritage, as well as a core visitor economy driver for the Dandenong Ranges.

It wouldn't be overstating the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic to say that Puffing Billy Railway has not been threatened in such a way since the railway was closed in the 1950's. These impacts will be felt for many years as we recover and return to a sustainable organisation.

The introduction of the wonderful Puffing Billy Railway Lakeside Visitor Centre provides the operational flexibility that is at the core of our investments in the PBR Master Plan.

Puffing Billy Railway will shortly transition to the new Puffing Billy Railway Act 2022 – a modernised governance structure that builds on the sustainability theme.


Annual Business Plans will continue to be developed and aligned to this Strategic Plan, and as funds become available we will invest further to achieve the aims of the PBR Master Plan.

Puffing Billy is much more than a train ride – it transports visitors on a magical journey that becomes a cherished lifetime memory. We are Australia's foremost operating steam railway and one of the largest steam and heritage railways in the world. Our history spans a period of 122 years.

Remarkably, for more than half that span, it has operated every day except Christmas Day as a volunteer-based not-for-profit body, carrying millions of passengers from around the world.

The narrow-gauge line between Belgrave and Gembrook in Victoria survives as one of the most intact examples of pioneering railway infrastructure in Australia. Its steeply graded banks, trestle bridges, line-side telegraph, signalling and rolling stock are of an era elsewhere supplanted by more modern technology.

This railway takes its "era of significance", dating from 1900 to 1930, seriously. This emphasis has held the Organisation in good stead over the years and is the key to understanding the philosophy which drives the Emerald Tourist Railway Board in achieving preservation goals.


The 2'6" gauge line to Gembrook opened in 1900, initially to carry produce, livestock and timber to Ferntree Gully, where the freight was transferred to broad gauge trains. However, it quickly became a great favourite of Melburnians, seeking a leisurely way of visiting "the hills".

The Railway closed in 1954 after a major landslide near Menzies Creek, and a succession of "Young Sun" specials was organised by the Melbourne daily newspaper to farewell the Railway. The success of these specials brought about the formation of the Puffing Billy Preservation Society which quickly reopened the Railway for the public to enjoy.

To enhance the visitor experience and ensure volunteers also enjoy their time on the railway, Puffing Billy continues to evolve in the experiences it provides, and the facilities that are managed. The recently opened Lakeside Visitor Centre Is the centrepiece of recent upgrades to secure the longer-term future of the railway; providing the visitor experience that is expected at a world class heritage experience.

The Puffing Billy Railway heritage experience relies on the skills and passion of volunteers and staff that work diligently behind the scenes, as well as in public facing roles, to develop and support the ongoing celebration of our beautiful heritage railway. As the community evolves, the people that operate Puffing Billy Railway will also evolve, welcoming more community minded and resourceful people to our team.

We honour our proud history and are committed to continuing to deliver memorable journeys for our visitors, volunteers, and staff well into the future.



In 2022, the Victorian Parliament passed the new Puffing Billy Railway Act 2022, that aims to modernise the act that governs the Railway's operations. It also responds to the findings of the 2018 Victorian Ombudsman Report, confirms Puffing Billy Railway as a volunteer-based organisation and develops the future framework for its ongoing success.

Under the new Puffing Billy Railway Act 2022, Puffing Billy Railway remains a statutory authority. The Authority currently has approximately 100 staff responsible for the operational management of the railway and its services.

The organisation operates through the efforts of valued volunteers who dedicate their personal time to providing volunteer services across the railway that include but is not limited to administration, events, station masters, conductors and passenger guides, engine cleaners, firemen, drivers, track patrollers, guards and a range of workshop, museum, and restoration projects.

The Puffing Billy Railway Board, formerly referred to as the Emerald Tourist Railway Board, acknowledge the Puffing Billy Preservation Society as pioneers that preserved the railway after its closure in the 1950s and thank them for their efforts to support the railway over many years.

The Puffing Billy Railway Board continues to look for ways to continue this legacy through the development of a documented Memorandum of Understanding between two separate legal entities. We look forward to their ongoing support to the railway's success in the future.

The Puffing Billy Railway operating environment has dramatically changed since the release of the 2019 – 2023 PBR Strategic Plan. The effects of COVID-19 on travel markets, plus workforce issues across all tourism and hospitality organisations have also been felt by Puffing Billy Railway.

The opening of the Puffing Billy Railway Lakeside Visitor Centre is a significant achievement that will provide the Railway with the opportunity to maximise the potential of the whole corridor and is pivotal to the future of the longer-term sustainability of Puffing Billy Railway.

The 2022 – 2025 Puffing Billy Railway Strategic Plan aims to consolidate the new Puffing Billy Railway Act, adapt the Railway's operations to the immediate impacts of COVID-19, and establish the future direction of the Railway's pathway to sustainability.




COMMIT TO AND DELIVER A SUSTAINABLE FUTURE.

PRIORITY PROJECTS

For Puffing Billy Railway to achieve the aim of being a sustainable heritage railway, we need to continue to develop the primary aims of the Puffing Billy Railway Master Plan 2017.

The priority projects for Puffing Billy Railway aims to build for the future, provide operational flexibility to mitigate risk and capture new opportunities, whilst also continuing to enhance the heritage aims of preservation with a focus on our era of significance.

- Priority projects are not in order of priority.
- There are projects of different scales and readiness, however, all are consistent with the Puffing Billy Railway Master Plan 2017.
- Funding opportunities are diverse and have different focuses. This will impact how projects are progressed.
